CONFERENCE OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the PSAC Atlantic Regional Conference for Racially Visible Members are:

- To develop strategies to work across locals, regions and components to build coalitions and networks for advocacy
- To broaden the base of activists by recruiting, training and mobilizing new and less engaged racialized members, such as young workers and those from equity seeking groups, in political action campaigning
- To empower and inspire Racially Visible Members to become active in their union, community and workplaces.

WORKSHOPS

The workshops will focus on ways to better engage and empower racialized activists at all levels of the union.

Policy to Address Systemic Racism

This workshop will focus on gathering information to develop a policy to address systemic racism in different forms: and ways to address it through the workplace, our union and our communities.

Building Our Power for Change

This workshop will focus on ways to better engage and empower racialized activists at all levels of the union. Participants will be invited to identify political priorities and develop strategies to mobilize racialized PSAC members to advocate for these issues through different structures in the union (e.g. political action and campaigns, bargaining, regional and workplace committees, representation, etc.).

<u>Harassment and Discrimination – Recognizing and Challenging it in Our Workplaces</u>

This workshop is designed to help members recognize and challenge race-based harassment and discrimination in their workplaces. Members will be provided the tools and vocabulary.

PARTICIPANTS

1. <u>Delegates</u>

PSAC members in good standing and who self-identify as Racially Visible (as per page 12) may apply to be a delegate to this Conference. Priority will be given to members who are active champions of Racialized Workers' Rights in their union, workplace or community. The selection of delegates will take into account representation such as Geography, Component, DCL, Young Workers, Gender and other Equity Groups.

2. <u>Travel and Expenses:</u>

Travel plans and funding will be made on a case by case basis, depending on the delegate's location and in accordance with the PSAC National Travel Policy. Cost covered are as follows:

- Travel cost including ground transportation
- Hotel accommodations costs for those commuting more than 100km away from the conference site. Parking costs will be part of the accommodation cost.
- Loss of salary
- · Per diems for meals
- Incidental costs for those in travel status
- Family Care as per the PSAC Family Care policy
- · Cost related to accessibility requirements

All delegates to the Conference will be funded according to the PSAC National Travel Policy http://psacunion.ca/psac-travel-policy

3. Loss of Salary:

Loss of salary will be compensated for any hours that a delegate was regularly scheduled to work. Any loss of salary claims must have prior approval from the Halifax Regional Office. Loss of Salary may be compensated for travel on **Thursday, March 12**th, **2020** for delegates travelling more than **100km** away from the conference location and who cannot travel after working hours.

Loss of Salary will be paid for delegates who would be scheduled to work on Friday, March 13, 2020. Weekend shift will require shift schedule.

4. Accommodation:

Hotel accommodations will be provided and booked by the PSAC for the delegates who live 100kms or more from the conference site (Lord Nelson Hotel).

5. Family Care:

Family Care costs for delegates will be reimbursed as per the PSAC Family Care Policy http://psacunion.ca/family-care-policy

SELECTION OF DELEGATES

If you are selected as a delegate to this conference, you will be advised by email and/or telephone by February 21, 2019.

We look forward to the second PSAC-Atlantic Regional Racially Visible Members Conference in 2020. This conference is an opportunity for our members to continue the important work of maintaining and improving the activism of the Union in the struggle to improve the Human Rights and working conditions of all PSAC members.
